Thanks to US support for global health research, Americans and millions of people around the world no longer live in fear of diseases such as polio and measles, and many afflicted with negleted diseases are living longer, healthier lives. The GHTC carries out policy analysis, forms strategic alliances, and conducts outreach to US policymakers about the need for new technologies that will improve health in developing countries.

Coalition members advocate for specific topics, including:

- Public financing. We call for increased and coordinated investments from the US government for global health research and development.
- Regulatory pathways. We advocate for streamlined regulatory processes to speed the delivery of safe and effective global health technologies.
- Incentives and innovative financing. We support the adoption of new market-based incentives to encourage private industry investments in global health research and development.
