

Mozambique's Community Health Volunteers (CHVs)

1

Selection

CHVs are volunteers dedicated to implementing interventions aimed at improving the health of their communities. Their selection is based on the principle of volunteerism and support from community leaders.



2

Training

CHVs are trained in communication, community mobilization, inclusion, common child diseases, data collection and reporting, and gender-sensitive interventions.



3

Deployment

CHVs work in coordination with the health facility and APS. They are deployed to support preventive health activities, information, communication and health education for behavior change and demand creation for services. CHVs receive t-shirts and forms to track their activities and refer patients to the APS. The project expects to deploy 4,300 CHVs in the four districts of the project.



Outcomes: Stronger systems, quality data, healthy children.

Data Supervision Visits

CHVs collect data in dedicated registers and submit it to the APS, who compile and aggregate the information from all the CHVs in their catchment into a monthly report.



4

Supervision

APS coordinate CHVs within their catchment areas. They regularly participate in CHV activities, relay information from the health facility, and provide feedback on their performance.
