Fact-finding questions cost sharing update

USAID requires a 5 percent cost sharing for all awards, which can come from volunteer services, donated employee time, donated supplies, cash contributions, donated equipment, or project co-funding. They also requested a minor edit to the indirect cost information. This information was not included in the original request for application (RFA). We revised the RFA and received a few questions from applicants. The text below contains answers to all of the new fact-finding questions asked by applicants as result of these modifications. Questions from applicants:

- 1. In reviewing the budget template, I noticed that there is not a line item for cost share on the Summary Tab. Hopefully that is intentional?
 - Applicants only need to include cost sharing on the detail tab of the detailed budget and in the budget narrative.
- 2. Can the sources of cost sharing be from another grant? If so is NIH ok? Can effort from volunteer time by collaborators on the project eligible for this cost-sharing of the awards?

Yes, cost sharing can be from another grant, but that grant must be non-US government funded. The NIH grant is not eligible for cost sharing since it is a US government funded award. Volunteer time by collaborators would be eligible. Refer to <u>2 CFR 200.306(e)</u> for more information.
